



Camp Counselor Job Description

The **Camp Counselor** is responsible for helping campers to understand their inherent value as children of God. They are also responsible for the safety and well-being of the campers while they are in their care. All Camp Counselors are expected to embody our values of empowering leaders by guiding Leaders in Training (L.I.T.s) as they learn to lead.

Reports to: Camp Noah Co-Director.

Qualifications:

- You must be a Christian;
- You must be presently an active member of or regularly attending a Christian church
- You must have turned 16 prior to the start of training
- You must have a passion for working with children in urban, under-resourced communities
- You must be highly self-motivated, organized, flexible, and able to work independently
- Preferred: Experience working with elementary and/or middle school aged children

Responsibilities:

- Develop positive, discipling relationships with children in camp
- Work with the camp team including Station Teachers, L.I.T.s and leadership staff in implementing the curriculum and behavior system to ensure a safe, fun environment
- Help guide the L.I.T.s to have a deeper understanding of managing camper behavior and leadership
- Know, enforce and follow all safety guidelines at Camp Noah
- Know and ALL emergency procedures related to Camp Noah
- Participate in regular camp team meetings
- Utilize positive behavior interventions and supports to manage camper behavior
- Manage daily paperwork necessary for your team
- Document any behavior issues, incidents and/or injuries that require documentation
- Identify any behavior needs and notify a Co-Director
- Alert leadership staff of any building/maintenance issues
- Help with setup and breakdown of camp space each day
- Other duties that may be assigned

DATES: Training July 6-9, July 12-August 20; **HOURS:** 9-5:30pm (with 30 minute break)

COMPENSATION: Starts at \$300/week
